Thank you for affiliating your fair with the Society for Science & the Public for the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair 2018. We look forward to an exciting science fair season and a wonderful Intel ISEF 2018 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Intel ISEF 2018 Regional Award Chart of Action For International Fairs

This guide is to give you an overview of the deadlines and requirements of what needs to be done at the fair level. It also lists information on what the student needs to accomplish to collect their award.

Materials for Fair Director or Awards Chair to Complete After Winner Selection:

American Meteorological Society	2 Certificates (<i>enclosed</i>)	Winning projects should be limited to the atmospheric and related oceanic and hydrologic sciences. A summary of winners should be e-mailed to Erica Callahan at sciencefair@ametsoc.org by August 1, 2018 .
American Psychological Association	1 Certificate (<i>enclosed</i>)	APA Acceptance Form to be completed by either the fair director or the award recipient within one month of the completion of the fair at http://forms.apa.org/ed/rsf/ . The Chair of the awards committee or the fair director is asked to fill in the name of the award winner on the certificate and present to the winner at the awards ceremony or awards announcement.
Association for Women Geoscientists	1 Certificate (<i>enclosed</i>)	Complete and return the AWG Acceptance Form by mail or e-mail jyhoney@sbcglobal.net to Valerie Honeycutt within one month after your fair date . Winner should be female.
ASU Walton Sustainability Solutions Initiatives	2 Certificates (<i>online</i>)	The award committee or the fair director is responsible for completing the nomination form and certificates. Two students will be chosen to win certificates (to be completed online at https://sustainability.asu.edu/sustainabilitysolutions/wp-content/gios-uploads/sites/15/2012/09/intel-regional-certificate-2018-form.pdf). Entry must be emailed by May 1, 2018 to be considered. Grand Prize winner will be announced via email on July 1, 2017. Three Grand Prize winners will receive a \$500 cash award. Winners will be announced via email on July 1, 2018.

The Winner Application Sheet and the ECS Certificate MUST then be given to the winner at your awards ceremony. The ECS winner is responsible for returning all documents along with a completed (MUST be typed) Wire Transfer form to Society for Science & the Public by the deadline of May 31, 2018 . Intel ISEF (in separate envelope)	Certificates (number dependent upon fair allocation), Paid trip to Intel ISEF	Finalists' online questionnaire and abstracts must be completed and documentation received by SSP within 12 calendar days of the completion of your fair. The last date to hold an Intel-ISEF affiliated fair is April 15, 2018. <u>And all paperwork must be submitted online by April 18, 2018.</u>
Mu Alpha Theta	1 Certificate (<i>enclosed</i>)	Complete and submit the Mu Alpha Theta Award Acceptance Form <u>within 30 days after your fair date</u> by e-mail to info@mualphatheta.org . Affiliated fair judges should use the criteria supplied to select the winner. Individual or group project in grades 9-12 only.
Ricoh USA, Inc.	1-2 Certificates (<i>online</i>)	Fair Director or Administrator must complete the online questionnaire at https://ricoh.qualtrics.com/RSDA.2018 in order to issue a Ricoh Sustainable Development Award (RSDA) Certificate. If necessary, please complete the questionnaire right after the selection of an award winner and print the certificate out with the student's name and a date, prior to your award ceremony. RSDA Certificates can be provided to one or two projects.
Society for In Vitro Biology	1 Certificate (<i>enclosed</i>)	Please complete the SIVB Award Acceptance <i>Form</i> and mail, fax (910-755-5432) or email (sivb@sivb.org) as promptly as possible after your fair . Winners should be in 11 th grade with an exhibit in the area of plant or animal in vitro biology or tissue culture.

<p>Yale Science and Engineering Association</p>	<p>1 Preliminary Certificate (enclosed)</p>	<p>Complete and present the "Preliminary Certificate" and Award Acceptance form to your 11th grade winner in the Computer Science, Engineering, Physics or Chemistry category. In extraordinary cases it may be awarded to a 10th or 12th grade project. Please ask that the winner follow the instructions carefully and note submission deadline. This must be completed ONLINE at http://ScienceFairs.YSEA.org no later than May 30, 2018. Only a single project may win at any given fair. A formal certificate and medallion will be mailed to the winner by the end of September 2018.</p>
